History And Definition The function of probation has grown gradually through many years until it is now a definitely established factor in court procedure. It grew originally out of the practice of suspending sentences in cases in which the defendants had been convicted, and imprisonment manifestly promised to be of little or no avail. The courts, instead of executing the sentence prescribed by law, had the right of indefinitely postponing it and releasing the defendants conditionally on good behavior, the understanding being that if they transgressed the law, they would be returned for sentence on the original conviction, but if they behaved, the sentence would be indefinitely postponed and they would be finally discharged. It naturally followed that during this period of conditional release, the court could require some record of the conduct of the persons so treated....
