Excerpt: . . . has proved to us that this crosswise undercutting affords an excellent hold. The bold is still further increased if we cut the gutters by holding the diamond disc, not at right angles, but at an acute angle to the ground porcelain inlay, and if we provide one half of the inlay with gutters running to the left, and the other half with gutters running to the right. The gutters should be cut as deeply as the ground inlay allows, and they should also reach over the edge, whereby the hold will be still greater. For the undercutting of ground inlays I only employ diamond discs, not FrG. 43. the very small ones, only the medium and large; but thin metal discs fed with wet carborundum powder are by many recommended for this purpose (Fig. 44). In undercutting the inlay, porcelain dust mixed with water...
